
Subject: Programs to Promote the Two Official Linguistic Communities

1.0 PURPOSE

In accordance with section 3 of [An Act Recognizing the Equality of the Two Official Linguistic Communities in New Brunswick](#), this policy identifies the responsibilities, standards, and procedures for library programs intended to promote the cultural, economic, educational, and social development of the English and French linguistic communities in New Brunswick.

2.0 APPLICATION

This policy applies to programs and is to be adhered to by New Brunswick Public Library Service (NBPLS) staff.

3.0 DEFINITIONS

Linguistic community means either the English or French linguistic community of New Brunswick within the meaning of section 16.1 of the [Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms](#).

Official languages means the official languages (English and French) of New Brunswick identified in subsection 16(2) of the [Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms](#).

A **program** is an activity or event delivered to library patrons.

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5.0 GOALS / PRINCIPLES

NBPLS strives to promote the cultural, economic, educational and social development of the official linguistic communities in New Brunswick.

Thus, it is the policy of NBPLS to develop:

- English programs to promote the cultural, economic, educational, and social development of the English linguistic community; and
- French programs to promote the cultural, economic, educational, and social development of the French linguistic community.

6.0 REQUIREMENTS / STANDARDS

6.1 RESPONSABILITES

6.1.2 Library Managers/ Directors will consider community needs and requests, availability of resources at the library and in the community, and the linguistic make-up of the intended audience to develop and deliver programs to promote the cultural, economic, educational, and social development of the official linguistic communities.

- To ensure that the needs of both official linguistic communities are appropriately addressed through library programs, Library Managers/Directors will focus outreach efforts on both linguistic communities.

6.1.3 Regional office staff and staff of other libraries may assist libraries in creating and/or delivering programs in either or both official language(s) as may be necessary.

6.1.4 Regional office staff will develop regional programs in either or both official language(s).

6.1.5 Provincial office staff will develop provincial programs in either or both official language(s).

6.1.6 Requests for Programs

- Library staff are to welcome programming requests from the public for programs in either or both official language(s).
- Library staff are to direct programming requests for programs in either or both official language(s) from the public to the Library Manager/Director or other designated staff member.

- Library Managers/Directors or other designated staff members are to address all reasonable requests from the public for programs.

8.0 REGIONAL GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES

In consultation with the Provincial Office, Regional Directors may develop additional guidelines and procedures consistent with and necessary to support this policy.
