## Public-School Library Internet Access

### Terms and Conditions for Use

---

This library offers public Internet access. **By using the library's public Internet service, you are accepting the following terms and conditions:**

1. **Internet access on school designated computers is filtered for student use during school hours.**
2. **Internet access on public designated computers is filter-free for public use during all open hours.**
3. You must register with library staff and respect any time limits stipulated for Internet usage.
4. Library staff do not control information accessed through the Internet and cannot be held responsible for its content.
5. The library is not responsible for any damages or loss of data you may experience while using public Internet access.
6. Your Internet activity may be traceable to you.
7. **Responsibility for a child's use of the Internet rests solely with his or her parent or legal guardian.**
8. **You must be considerate of the values of other library patrons and the presence of children in the library when displaying content that may be considered controversial.**
9. **You shall refrain from:**
  - a) Making unauthorized copies of any data protected by copyright or digital property laws;
  - b) Intentionally damaging library equipment or altering the setup of computers in use at the library;
  - c) Creating, accessing, viewing, storing, sending or printing any text, image, sound or any other file which is considered to be unlawful. The New Brunswick public library system defines **illegal material according to the Criminal Code of Canada which includes obscenity, child pornography, hatred and sedition;**
  - d) Invading the privacy of others by attempting to modify or gain access to files, passwords, or data belonging to others, or by attempting to intercept private communications or e-mails.

## Public-School Library Wireless Internet Access

### Terms and Conditions for Use

---

This library offers wireless (Wi-Fi) Internet access after school hours for properly equipped communication devices. **By using the library's wireless Internet service, you are accepting the following terms and conditions:**

1. Wireless Internet access will be provided as resources permit.
2. Users who transfer excessive amounts of data on an ongoing basis may have their wireless Internet connection blocked so that reasonable access speeds can be maintained for other public library Internet users. A wireless Internet connection may be unblocked on a case-by-case basis by submitting a written request to the Regional Director.
3. **Internet access on school designated computers is filtered for student use during school hours.**
4. **Internet access on public designated computers is filter-free for public use during all open hours.**
5. You must register with library staff and respect any time limits stipulated for Internet usage.
6. Library staff do not control information accessed through the Internet and cannot be held responsible for its content.
7. The library assumes no responsibility for the safety of your equipment or for any damage to, or alteration or corruption of the configuration, security, or data files of your notebook/laptop computer or other wireless device resulting from connection to the library's wireless access.
8. The wireless network is **not** secure. Information sent to and from your notebook/laptop computer or other wireless device may be captured by anyone else with a wireless device and the appropriate software.
9. Depending on the sites you chose to visit on the Internet, you may be exposed to a virus or other harmful computer programs that may cause loss of data or injure your notebook/laptop computer or other device.
10. Your Internet activity may be traceable to you.

15. Technical support relating to wireless Internet access, personal computing and communication devices is your responsibility.

16. No guarantee can be made that you will be able to make a wireless connection. The library has tried to make wireless access as available as possible, but you may encounter some "dead" spots where wireless reception is limited. If you have trouble accessing the Internet or staying online please move to a different location within the library.

17. The library will allow access to electrical outlets for wireless access when they are available. The library cannot provide printing services for wireless access.

### **Technical Requirements**

---

You will need a notebook/laptop computer or other wireless device with 802.11b or 802.11g wireless networking capability.

If you are not sure if your notebook/laptop computer or other device has this functionality, please check with the manufacturer or supplier of your equipment.

If your notebook/laptop computer or other device does not include wireless networking, you may be able to purchase a variety of external notebook/laptop PC cards and USB devices to give you this capability. The manufacturer or supplier of your equipment, or local technology merchants can help you find the right product for your notebook/laptop
