1. Demographics and Background:

- Largest First Nation community in New Brunswick
- over 3,000 people
- •45% under 25 years old
 - High birth rate
 - •Life expectancy 6-8 years lower than non-First Nation •

3. Elsipogtog First Nation Health and Wellness Profile

Rates of **chronic health problems** such as diabetes, heart disease, kidney disease, high blood pressure and obesity are **4 to 10 times higher than national average**

Continued effects of colonialism contribute to high rates of:

- Family violence;
- Substance abuse, FASD;
- Suicide and high risk behaviours;
- Crimes rates (<u>10 times</u> higher than the 3 adjacent non-First Nation communities <u>combined</u>;)
- Poor socio-economic development (high poverty)
- High unemployment
- Lower literacy rate
- Compounded and collective trauma



6 out of the 10 poorest areas in Canada are NB First Nations communities: Kingsclear, Eel Ground, Tobique, Elsipogtog, Red Bank and Esgenoopetitj (Burnt Church).

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
EHWC Mental Health and Wellness: Our Commitment

Our Success is due to:


- High degree of community **resilience**, **strength** and **capacity**;
